What has happened so far

IN BOULDER

OVER 2,500 KIDS LOST FREE-AND-REDUCED LUNCH.

Families facing food insecurity often rely on five days worth of school-provided meals to keep their children from becoming hungry — but with schools closed, families are left to fill the gap through emergency food distribution.

IN COLORADO

AN OVER 2,000% INCREASE IN UNEMPLOYMENT CLAIMS.

As of April 9th, more than 147,000 unemployment claims have been submitted in Colorado, an exponential increase from this time last year. At the height of the 2008 recession, there were only 7,700 unemployment claims.

AROUND THE WORLD

POVERTY EXACERBATES THE SPREAD OF THE VIRUS.

People with low-incomes are hit the heaviest by the coronavirus. Low-wage jobs are less likely to have remote work options, provide paid sick leave, or include sufficient healthcare benefits. These inequalities cause a rippling effect throughout our society, worsening health outcomes for everyone.

WHAT WE'RE DOING ABOUT IT

EFAA is increasing the amount of emergency food to ensure that people facing economic hardship throughout this pandemic do not go hungry because of it. This will allow us to serve 350-400 households per week, meeting the increased demand for services.

Between April and June, EFAA aims to nearly double the amount of financial assistance for families and individuals to help mitigate the effects of the coronavirus.
