EFAA HAS BEEN ABLE TO ...

- **More than DOUBLE the amount of financial assistance available per household.** EFAA has also modified eligibility requirements so that if families are still unable to meet their needs after receiving assistance, they can receive additional support.
- **Increase investments in our food bank safety** by upgrading food bank staffing, increasing sanitation and cleaning services, and ramping up food purchases to meet the community need safely, resulting in roughly \$7,500 in additional expenses per week.




YOUR IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS

118% INCREASE IN FINANCIAL AID

EFAA distributed roughly \$964,120 in direct financial assistance from January through the end of May this year, a 118% increase from this time last year. **Because of your support, EFAA is able to provide these funds directly to those who need them the most.**



WHO WE'RE HELPING

About one in five households seeking economic relief due to Covid-19 is new to EFAA. The majority of financial assistance for rent is going to Latinx families with children, many who are ineligible for other benefits. Funds are also used to help seniors, individuals, and our neighbors in Boulder County's mountain communities.

45% INCREASE IN APPOINTMENTS

By reallocating more staff time for case management, **EFAA has been able to expand the number of appointments available, serving about 90 households per week on average.** Case managers help to not only distribute financial assistance, but also work with participants to navigate other resources such as unemployment, SNAP, Medicaid, and more.



OVER 16,000 FOOD BAGS DISTRIBUTED

Through June, EFAA has distributed 16,013 grab-and-go food bags through our food bank, the equivalent of 176,815 meals! Your support allows EFAA to safely provide food to our neighbors facing crisis.
