Save as much as \$200 on tax filing fees!

You may also qualify for valuable tax credits like the Earned Income Tax Credit which is worth as much as \$6,728 cash back, **but you must file your taxes to claim the credits!**

What to bring

- Social Security Card or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) for *each* family member on your return
- Photo ID
- W-2s, 1099s and all othertax-related documents for 2021
- Self-employed/contractors: 1099-Misc, 1099-K and record of all income and expenses
- Education expenses: Account statement and 1098-T
- Childcare expenses: Total paid to childcare provider, name, address, phone number and Tax ID Number
- Charitable donations
- Form 1095-A if insurance was purchased through the health care marketplace
- Checking and savings account numbers and bank routing number if using direct deposit for your refund
- A copy of your 2020 tax return, if available
- · Letter 6417 (if applicable)

For joint returns, both spouses must be present to sign the required forms
