To answer that question, EFAA created a snapshot of Boulder County's poverty, income and wages, child wellbeing, food security, housing affordability and other indicators.


POVERTY



EMPLOYMENT

IS BACK TO PRE-PANDEMIC LEVELS

Most recent unemployment rate for Boulder County is 2.4% from a peak of 9.9% (May 2020) BUT SALARY GAINS ARE NOT KEEPING PACE with the increase in local cost of living



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CHILDREN'S WELLBEING

CHILDREN CONTINUE TO FEEL THE IMPACTS OF LIVING IN POVERTY: THE STRESS OF NOT HAVING ENOUGH NUTRITIOUS FOOD OR A STABLE PLACE TO LIVE IMPACT THEIR PHYSICAL AND MENTAL HEALTH AS WELL AS THEIR CHANCES TO SUCCEED IN SCHOOL AND BEYOND.
