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Dear Friends,

For many of us, this past year represented a time for recovery and a return to "normal." But for lower-income families and hourly workers in our community, the economic impacts of the pandemic, combined with rising food, housing, and childcare costs, created even greater challenges. As a result, community need is growing with more and more people unable to make ends meet. This has translated into large increases in residents coming to EFAA for food, financial assistance and other safety net supports.

Fortunately, our community is stepping up to meet the need. Thanks to the financial support of EFAA donors, and the dedication of our staff and volunteers, together, we were able support our neighbors in need.

Beyond meeting the basics for food and housing, EFAA has also expanded the programs we offer to participants. We are seeing meaningful achievements as families plot their course forward. Since launching the classes in 2021, this Spring, EFAA celebrated the more than 70 participants who completed our financial health course and 40 participants who completed a basic computing program.

In the next year, we will continue to support families as they navigate financial hardship in an extremely high-cost community. We will continue to invest in programming focused on income and wages, economic recovery, housing stability, and healthy child development to promote long-term economic resilience. And we will continue to use EFAA's voice to raise awareness on local policy issues so that the community safety net is not the only solution for local poverty and family homelessness.

This important work would not be possible without the support of our community. With the help of thousands of generous volunteers and donors like you, we can make Boulder County a place where everyone has the opportunity to thrive.

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


